Created to help the Law Family support causes in our community.





A LIFE OF SERVICE

Eugene Triplett is a community superhero, known for his volunteer work as a pharmacist at Culpeper Free Clinic, associate minister at Rising Zion Baptist Church and now, Chair of the Board of Directors for Northern Piedmont Community Foundation! A 4th generation farmer, Eugene follows in his grandfather's footsteps of raising cattle and growing produce to donate to local food banks. He shares what it means to him to carry on in that mission, "I get as much joy giving as they do from receiving it".

Eugene also works with Minority and Vetera Farmers of the Piedmont, Mid-Atlantic Food Resilience and Access Coalition (MAFRAC). 4P and others to connect local food farmers with food banks and other similar food distributors. Recently, he partnered with Wayland Blue Ridge Baptist Association to bring food from farms to churches to people. "It's not just food, but wholesome food to people, healthy food". He recounts, "Some families aren't big enough for a Christmas turkey, so they receive farm-raised chickens instead. The families come back and say that they've never tasted chicken so good as those raised on local farms." Wayland Blue Ridge Baptist Association began their first distribution to eight churches in July and currently have 21 and are still growing.

It's not about me. You support others that do what you can't, and indirectly, it will get done.

> After serving on the NPCF Board for 6 years (his first term of service) Eugene says that his service with the community foundation made him aware of all the nonprofits, what they're doing and how they can better connect to one another to create efficiencies and serve the communities. Piedmont Dispute Resolution Center's Peer Mediation in School Communities program provides trained peer mediators who facilitate a process of communication and problem solving that leads to resolution. Peer mediation is a chance for disputing students to sit face to face and talk, uninterrupted, so each side is heard. After the problem is defined, solutions are created and then evaluated. When an agreement is reached, it is written and signed.

COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE GRANT

Culpeper Renaissance's 1'm SOW Healthy Youth Initiative program provides nutrition education through monthly, interactive, live cooking demonstrations, seasonal scavenger hunts and \$5 Farm Fresh Dollars to be spent at the Culpeper Downtown Farmers Market. In addition to this program, the Market also offers SNAP matching, up to \$25 per transaction, allowing those receiving supplemental nutrition assistance program benefits from the state of Virginia to double their spending power on locally grown, farm fresh produce and meats.

KID PAN ALLEY RICHARD LYKES RAPPAHANNOCK COMMUNITY FUND

Obie-award winner Julie Portman completed her last play, The Man Who Eats Books about her Kathakali training in India, the week before she passed away. The play was never performed. Kid Pan Alley honored her by bringing the play to life. It's a powerful story about her years in Kerala, India as the first westerner and the first woman to study Kathakali in the traditional way--one teacher, one student. It's the story of her relationship to an ancient art form, with her teacher, and bringing what she learned back into her work in western theatre.

The Lykes Fund helped support Kid Pan Alley's work to stage the play in the

Rappahannock community.

YOUTH IN PHILANTHROPY

NPCF's Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) program provides young people from Culpeper, Fauquier, Madison and Rappahannock guidance, money, and mentorship to directly fund a local nonprofit organization.
