

RMD Open Scholarship is open all year round to students/citizens striving to improve their skills with training or certificate programs. Staff will assist with this scholarship.

Joe Timpane Building Trades Scholarship is open to students of any age who are pursuing training or further education in fields related to the building trades, including carpentry and wood working, plumbing, HVAC and electrical.

Poling Family Memorial Scholarship was established to honor the Poling Family. First priority is given to students pursuing a Fire Science Degree. If there are no such applicants, applications for culinary arts, theatre and visual arts will be considered. Financial need is a priority.

Cooley, Dearing and Rinker Educational Scholarship Fund supports students from Frederick, Rappahannock, City of Winchester and Warren counties.

Lois R. Snead Arts and Crafts Scholarship honors Mrs. Lois Snead, a woman of many talents. Applicants should be pursuing a field in the creative arts and have a teacher recommendation.

MEADE M. PALMER MEMORIAL FUND

The Meade M. Palmer Memorial Fund provides vital funding for all aspects of community well-being. Resources are concentrated geographically to preserve and enhance the quality of life to residents of Culpeper, Fauquier, Madison and Rappahannock counties. Award amounts generally range from \$500 to \$5,000.

PATRICIA AND NICHOLAS KORTLANDT MEMORIAL FUND

Patricia and Nicolaas Kortlandt were community-minded people who lived in Fauquier County for over 50 years and supported Fauquier through their farm and service to civic organizations and schools; they were adamant volunteers. This fund invites proposals for projects that strengthen the fabric of Fauquier County and that represents the diverse interests of Patricia and Nicolaas Kortlandt. Award amounts generally range from \$500 to \$10,000.

CULPEPER FOUNDATION FUND

This fund was originally designated as a way for citizens to give gifts to meet Culpeper's charitable and educational needs. Awards benefit Culpeper charitable organizations with amounts from \$500 to \$2,000.

GORDON THORNHILL EXCELLENCE IN YOUTH FOUNDATION FUND

The Gordon Thornhill Excellence in Youth grant supports nonprofit organizations for sports and agriculture related enrichment projects for the youth of Rappahannock County. Awards generally range from \$500 to \$5,000.

RICHARD LYKES ESTATE FUND

A bequest from long-time Rappahannock resident Richard Lykes enabled the Northern Piedmont Community Foundation to create the Richard Lykes Rappahannock Community Fund, which focuses on improving the quality of life in Rappahannock County. Award amounts generally range from \$500 to \$10,000.

COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE GRANT

This Grant represents a partnership between the PATH Foundation and NPCF and is open to 501(c)(3) organizations who have been in operation for at least 3 years. These awards support emergent needs and are allocated for operation support as well as program services. Grants may be awarded for proposals which improve access to services for underserved populations, test new ideas and different partnerships and address issues, concerns or opportunities in our communities. Amounts range from \$500 to \$25,000.

NOW & FOREVER FUND

This a community endowment set up by Northern Piedmont Community Foundation to support the changing needs of nonprofits in all four counties. Open application. Award amounts vary.

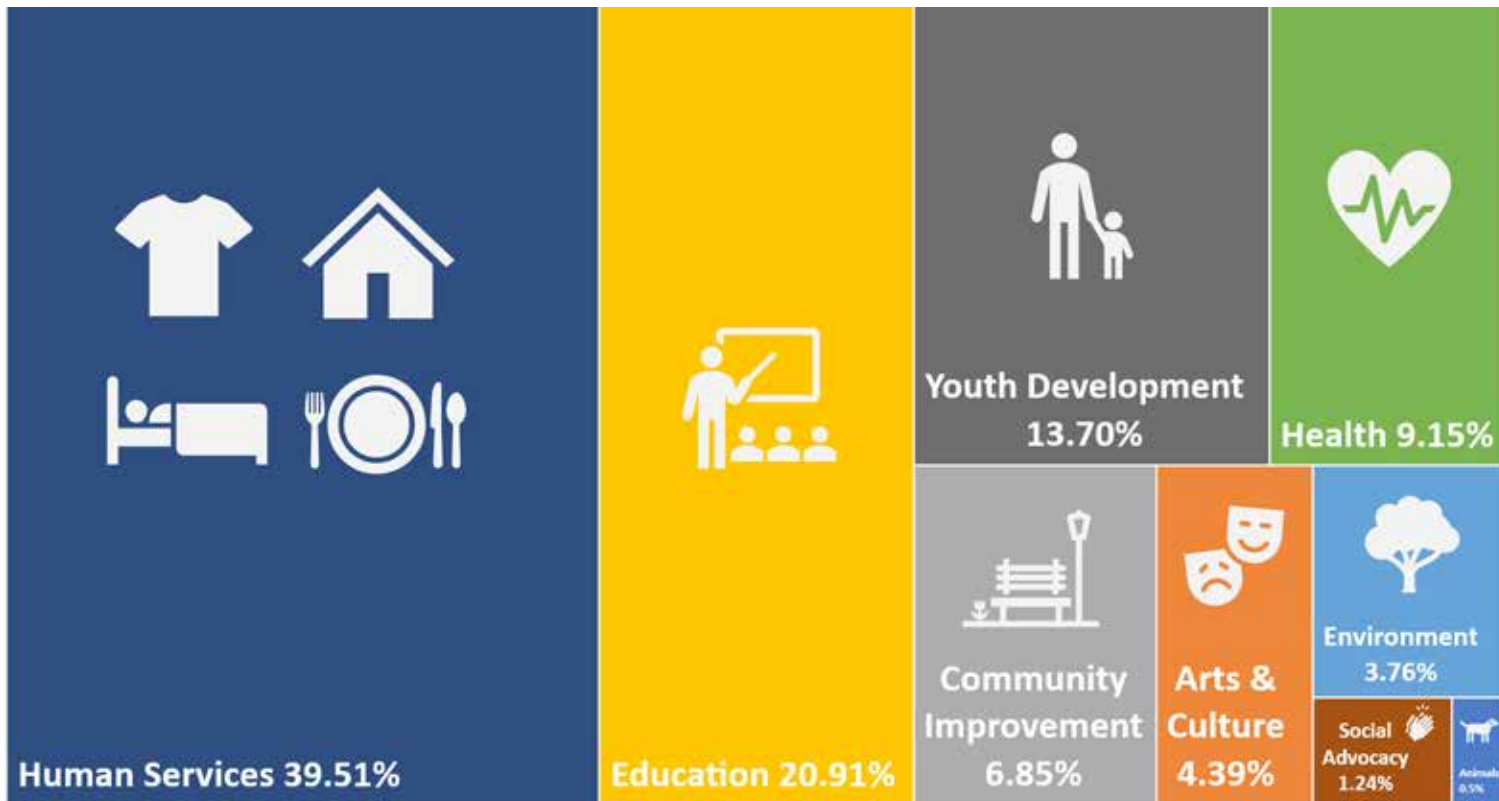
MADISON COUNTY COMMUNITY FUND
